New Film Shows He's Not the Real Killer

Documentary by noted investigator points to a surprising suspect.

With his upcoming trial for robbery in Las Vegas, O.J. Simpson is once again very much in the news. At the same time, a new documentary, *OJ is Guilty But Not of Murder, The Overlooked Suspect*, written and produced by William C. Dear, explores whether or not the former football star and celebrity, was indeed the actual killer of Nicole Simpson and Ron Goldman.

“After 14 years of personally investigating this case, *OJ is Guilty but Not of Murder* uncovers critical evidence pointing directly to a different suspect in this case, ---and it's definitely not OJ Simpson,” said renowned private investigator William C. Dear, the film's writer and producer. “There is little doubt that OJ was at the murder scene, but only after the murders, and it's time for the local authorities to pay attention and act on this information, so the families of these victims can know the truth---before the real killer strikes again.”

The compelling 84-minute documentary film, *OJ is Guilty but Not of Murder, The Overlooked Suspect* chronicles Dear's incredible 14 year search for the real truth in the murders of Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman. The film includes shocking new evidence about this case that was totally overlooked by the original investigators, that points directly to a surprising suspect very close to OJ.

The film is based on *OJ is Guilty but Not of Murder* (Atlas Books) written by Dear, a Dallas-based private investigator with more than 30 years experience in criminal and civil investigations. Mr. Dear served as a police officer in Florida and Texas and has been inducted into the Police Officers Hall of Fame as a private investigator. He is also a board-certified instructor who conducts training seminars throughout the United States for law enforcement officials, private investigators, and attorneys.
